Barry and Christoper were matched in September 2017.

During the beginning of their match, Barry was always looking for new things to try with Christopher. In late 2017/early 2018, Barry saw an advertisement offering the opportunity to come work on airplanes at the local airport in Superior. Christopher and Barry tried volunteering one week, and a passion was born. Christopher and Barry meet weekly, have a meal, and then head off to the airport together. Each season of this mentoring relationship has brought a different theme, which typically becomes the focus of conversation during their meal. Topics have included fishing, ATVing, driver's education, and school challenges. The interest in airplanes sparked during that initial volunteer session grew to a deep passion that informed Christopher's career goals and secured him a scholarship to move towards getting his pilot's license. Christopher will be a senior this coming school year and plans to attend NDSU. This summer, he's working with an airplane mechanic and learning how to repair airplanes. Barry plans to continue mentoring Christopher through his senior year, and will work with Christopher to determine how they'll keep in touch once their match graduates from Mentor North.
